

German Congress on Crime Prevention



The German Congress on Crime Prevention was founded in 1995 as an annual national convention for the field of crime prevention.

The aim of the German Congress on Crime Prevention is to present and strengthen crime prevention within a broad societal framework. Thus it contributes to crime reduction as well as reducing both the fear of crime, and the number of victims of crime.

As an annually organized congress, the main objectives of the Congress are:

- ④ Presenting and exchanging current and basic questions of crime prevention and its effectiveness
- ④ Bringing together partners within the field of crime prevention
- ④ Functioning as a forum for the practice of crime prevention and for fostering the exchange of expertise
- ④ Helping to get into contact at the international level and to exchange information
- ④ Discussing implementation strategies
- ④ Developing and disseminating recommendations for practice, politics, administration and research in the field of crime prevention

Annual International Forum - AIF



Since 2007 with the introduction of the Annual International Forum this is also true for the international perspective. With the AIF an international (non-German speaking) audience is addressed to share their experiences in crime prevention.

We believe that while the world is growing closer research as well as experience should be disseminated within a broad professional framework.

Therefore we ask international experts from all areas of crime prevention to introduce, share and discuss their ideas, goals, outcomes, projects and speeches with other experts and to experience the German modality of crime prevention.

The “DPT-Map” website searches specifically for projects, activities, institutions and persons in the field of crime prevention. This search for keywords is based on thematic databases published already in the internet by recognized specialized organizations.

At the start of www.dpt-map.de in October 2010, 2462 datasets could be searched, based on the websites of the German Congress on Crime Prevention (Deutscher Präventionstag – DPT) and the Crime Prevention Council of Lower Saxony (Landespräventionsrat Niedersachsen). As of February 18, 2012, 4594 datasets are available.



Beccaria Programms since 2003

The CRIME PREVENTION COUNCIL OF LOWER SAXONY (CPC) was founded in 1995 with the objective of reducing crime and improving the population's feeling of safety and security (www.lpr.niedersachsen.de).

The BECCARIA Programme is part of the CPC's activities. So far, there have been three consecutive projects, which were implemented within the framework of the European Union's AGIS- and ISEC-Programmes together with ten European partner organizations:


1. Quality management in crime prevention (2003-2005)
2. Qualification in crime prevention (2005-2007)
3. Knowledge transfer in crime prevention (2008-2011).

The BECCARIA Standards for ensuring quality in crime prevention projects have been translated so far into 16 languages (www.beccaria-standards.net).

The CPC's BECCARIA qualification programme has been offered annually since 2008 (www.beccaria.de) and has been presented *inter alia* at the XIth United Nations Congress on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice in Brazil in April 2010. Apart from this in-service training, the first Master's programme in crime prevention at a German university will start in fall 2011. It has also been developed in the context of the BECCARIA-Programme (www.master-kriminalpraevention.de).

The objective of the English-speaking BECCARIA Internet-Portal is to facilitate the access to globally available knowledge on crime prevention (www.beccariaportal.org).

Research on children, youth and families

The German Youth Institute is Germany's largest non-university research institute devoted to the study of children, youth, and families. Both at its headquarters in Munich and at a second office in Halle the non-profit organisation employs 140 social scientists. The Institute is mainly funded by the Federal Government and Germany's Laender. Additional funds come from the European Commission and national and international foundations.

The German Youth Institute employs a wide range of quantitative and qualitative research strategies and methods such as continuous social monitoring of changing living conditions and studies on specific socio-political questions. Based on its research results, the Institute provides expertise and data bases for policy makers and practitioners at the European, federal, regional, and local level. The Institute runs international research projects, participates in international conferences, and hosts foreign researchers, practitioners, and politicians.
