

On 1th July, Croatia, a country with a population of 4.5 million, became the 28th member State of the European Union. Croatia applied for EU membership in 2003. The entry negotiations were underway by 2005, and after the Treaty of Accession was signed in 2011 in Brussels, a referendum was held in 2012 during which 66% of participants voted in favour of EU accession. Thus after Slovenia. Croatia is the second former Yugoslav republic to join the EU.

Croatia is administratively divided into 423 municipalities (up to 30,000 inhabitants) and 127 cities (more than 10,000 inhabitants). The country is a melting pot of cultures due to its numerous borders: with Slovenia, Hungary, Serbia, Bosnia Herzegovina, Montenegro and the coastal border with Italy across the Adriatic.



In terms of justice, security and liberty, in 2006 the European Commission had initially evaluated that "considerable efforts" were needed. This stage of negotiations, which ended in 2010, was the object of a report handed at the beginning of 2013, in which the Commission concluded that the country had successfully responded to the European requirements, although further efforts needed to be made to prevent corruption.

Efus has built a strong network in Croatia with stakeholders in the field of local security. Efus participated in the urban conferences organised in 2009, 2010 and 2012 by the magazine Zastita ("Protection") on various issues related to

urban security (<u>read the article here</u>), as well as with the United Nations Development Programme – UNDP (<u>read the article here</u>).

Prevention of and Fight against Crime (ISEC)

Organised crime is a threat to European citizens, businesses and state institutions – as well as the economy as a whole. Criminals operate across borders, and consistent European-level action is the most effective way to stop them. The Programme Prevention of and Fight against Crime (ISEC) supports such activities.

ISEC has a budget of EUR 600 million for the period 2007–13 and contributes to citizens' security through projects that prevent and combat crime. Terrorism, human trafficking, child abuse, cybercrime, illicit drug and arms trafficking, corruption and fraud are a particular focus. The programme has four key strands:

- crime prevention
- law enforcement
- witness protection and support
- victim protection.

The EU supports actions intended to increase operational cooperation (e.g. strengthening networking, mutual confidence and

understanding, exchanging and disseminating information, experiences and best practices). Other funded activities include monitoring and evaluation, development and transfer of technology and methodology, training and exchanges and awareness-raising and dissemination.

In 2011 the Commission carried out a mid-term evaluation of the framework programme "Security and Safeguarding Liberties" and issued Commission Communication COM(2011)318 [2] [78 KB].

Professor David Farrington has been awarded the 2013 Stockholm Prize in Criminology.




