


Since 2007 with the introduction of the Annual International Forum an international (English speaking) audience is addressed to share their experiences in crime prevention.




Im Rahmen des Projektes „SPIN – Sozialräumliche Prävention in Netzwerken“ adaptiert der Landespräventionsrat Niedersachsen in Kooperation mit der LAG Soziale Brennpunkte Nds. e. V. das Steuerungsinstrument für die Präventionsarbeit „Communities That Care - CTC“ und setzt dies erstmals in Niedersachsen modellhaft um.

Das in den USA entwickelte Programm hat die sozialräumliche Steuerung der Prävention von jugendlichem Problemverhalten in den Bereichen Gewalt, Kriminalität, Alkohol- und Drogenmissbrauch, Schulabbruch und frühe Schwangerschaften zum Gegenstand.

CTC geht von neuesten wissenschaftlichen Erkenntnissen über die Wirkung und das Zusammenspiel verschiedener Risiko- und Schutzfaktoren in den vier Bereichen Familie, Schule, Wohnumfeld, sowie den Peer-Groups der Jugendlichen aus.

Zu den im Rahmen von CTC verwendeten Instrumenten gehören:

- eine Schüleruntersuchung, mit der die bestehenden Risiko- und Schutzfaktoren für jugendliches Verhalten in einem bestimmten Gebiet präzise gemessen werden können
- eine für kommunale Leitungskräfte und die Umsetzer vor Ort entwickelte Trainings- und Schulungenreihe, die diese in die Lage versetzt, auf der Basis der vorhandenen Daten ein gemeinsames Handlungskonzept zu entwickeln
- eine Zusammenstellung von verfügbaren, auf ihre Wirksamkeit geprüften, bzw. viel versprechenden Präventionsmaßnahmen und -programmen. Diese werden im Rahmen von CTC so dargestellt, dass erkennbar ist, welche Risikofaktoren sie effektiv mindern und welche Schutzfaktoren sie stärken können.

CTC beinhaltet eine Langzeitstrategie, um die lokalen Aktivitäten im Bereich der Prävention verstärkt

- auf den tatsächlichen Bedarf zu lenken (Analyse mittels Schülersurvey)
- aufeinander abzustimmen (Entwicklung Sozialraumprofil und lokaler Aktionspläne)
- in der Qualität der Maßnahmen zu verbessern (Verwendung geprüfter Präventionsprogramme im Rahmen lokaler Aktionspläne)

In der Projektdauer von SPIN von 2008 – 2011 wird CTC in drei Modellstandorten in Niedersachsen erprobt. Die drei Modellstandorte sind die


